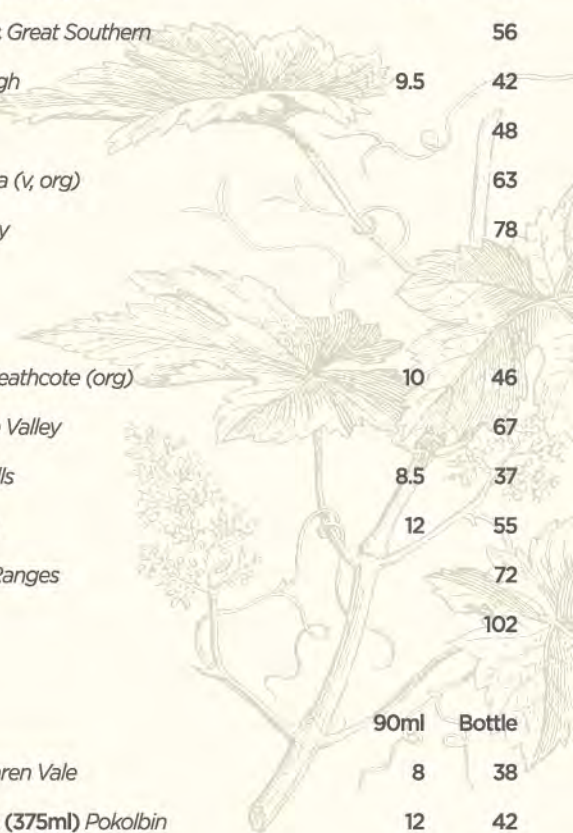

HISTORY OF THE GLEBE HOTEL

The first general publican's licence in Glebe was granted to The Glebe Tavern on the corner of Franklyn Place and Greek Street in 1844. The public house in Glebe quickly established itself as the centre of life and recreation for the artisans, quarrymen, blacksmiths and unskilled labourers with skittles, billiards and bagatelle being standard attractions in most of the pubs.

The names of many early Glebe pubs were direct transpositions of romantic names of England - Ancient Briton, British Lion, Queen of the Thames, Tynemouth Castle, Kentish and Bishop Gate but a few publicans showed some originality choosing indigenous or distinctive local names such as the Waratah, Australian Youth and The Currency Lass. The number of hotels in Glebe increased from 13 in 1860 to 15 in 1870, and by 1880 there were 22 licensed Glebe public houses.

The Australian Youth Hotel in Bay Street, one of only seven hotels operating in Glebe today, has had a continuous liquor licence since 1862 and is classified by the National Trust. It is a fine example of a mid-Victorian corner hotel and attached terrace, which is a prominent element in the street scape.

The Australian Youth is first depicted on 'this corner site' of the Town of Glebe in 1862. Following a series of conveyances, a Robert Walton purchased the land from the Hughes Subdivision in June 1860. Sands Sydney directories first show 'The Australian Youth Inn' at Bay Street in 1863 occupied by Robert Walton. From 1870 the listing for the subject site expands, indicating the construction of the pair of adjoining shops, then numbered 265 and 267 Bay Street.

In 1889 Martha Sarah Smith née Walton and Robert Ernest Walton mortgaged the hotel to Tooth & Co. Pty Ltd. How long the Australian Youth Inn was tied to Tooth & Co. Pty Ltd is not known.

From 1900 the Hotel was described as "63 - Australian Youth Hotel and Stables".

Alterations were undertaken the Australian Youth Hotel in 1912 when plans were lodged to the Metropolitan Licensing Court;

- Alterations to the 'stable' which had comprised stable, coach house and laundry to move the stable into the laundry and install men's toilets in the former stable
- Removal of two stairs on the ground floor and replacement with a single stair in the current location
- Increasing the size of the public bar by opening out the parlour and former passage
- Removing its fire place, increasing the serving space and counter length and relocating the parlour in the location of the former store
- Removal of one of the dining room's two fire places and the provision of a new entry off Glebe Street opening to a stair hall accessing the dining room, parlour and stairs

In 1927 Henry Albert Brigg sold 65 and 67 Bay Street to Tooth & Co. Pty Ltd.

In 1936 Clara Jones and Henry Albert Brigg (Trustees of the estate of Robert Walton) sold The Australian Youth Hotel to Tooth & Co. Pty Ltd

In 1986 Tooth & Co. Pty Ltd sold the hotel (63 Bay Street) and adjoining properties (65-67 Bay Street).

The pubs in Glebe, once working class institutions, began to seek a wider clientele.

Drinkers from the Glebe Estate began leaving the Australian Youth Hotel from 1985 when new light fittings, polished floor boards and other internal changes were made. Today the Australian Youth Hotel has again evolved and after extensive works in 2018 we now bring you 'The Glebe Hotel', Glebe's watering hole since 1862.
